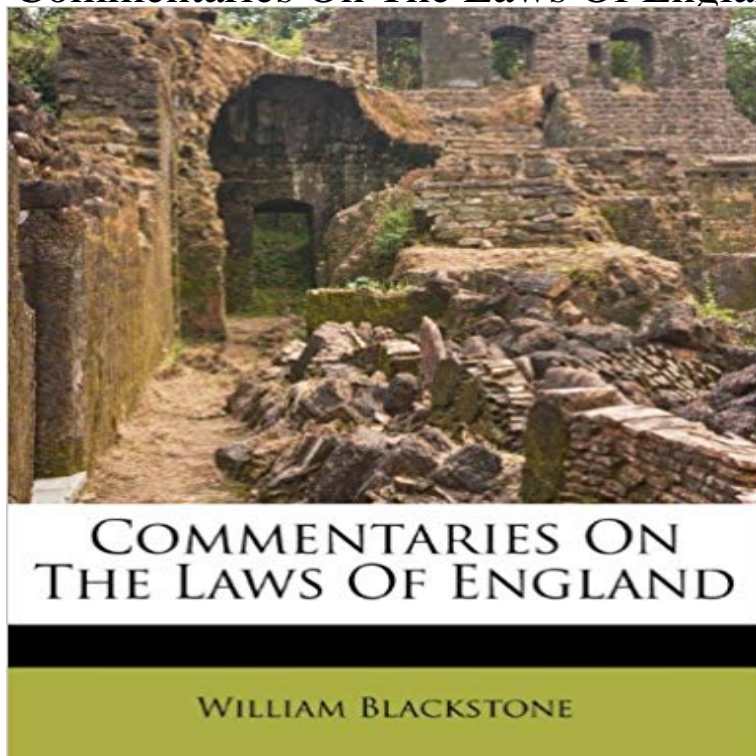


Commentaries On The Laws Of England
