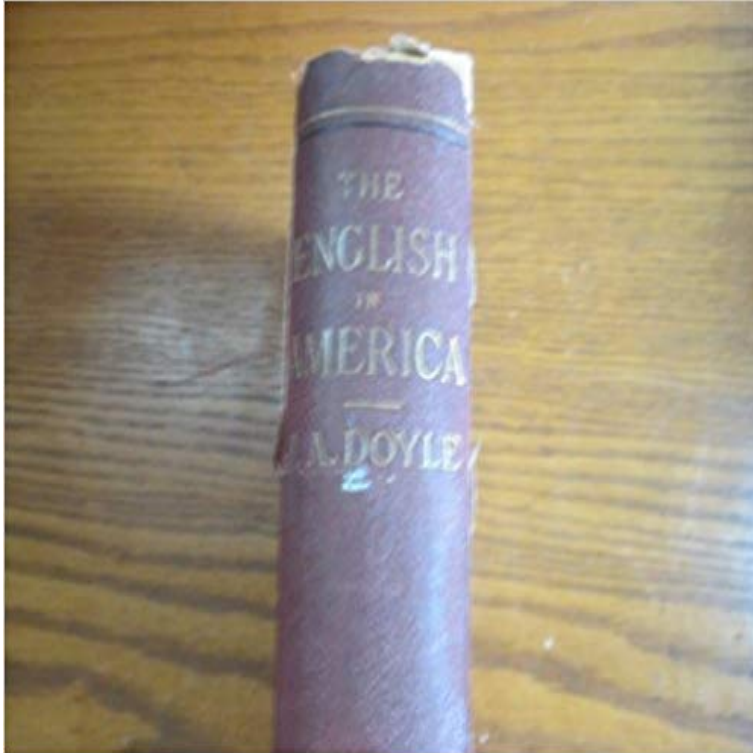


The English In America : The Puritan Colonies



Doyle's 1886 publication was among the very first substantial histories of the American colonies based exhaustively on original documentary sources, and presented in this volume a complete history of the Plymouth Pilgrims and their establishment of the Massachusetts Bay colony, the establishment of Rhode Island by Roger Williams and the Antinomians, and the other New England settlements in Connecticut, Maine, and elsewhere. The work takes the history up to the establishment of the New England Confederation, and presents detailed studies of relations with the Native Americans, the Indian wars, the early leaders in all the settlements, and the difficulties of establishing and securing them up to the decade of the 1660s.
